#### **GETTING IN LINE WITH GOD**

Several years ago, Rev. Charles Myricks spoke to WPA Ministries about the effectiveness of alignment. Recently I have been pondering the question: What does alignment look like? With whom are we to be aligned? How will alignment affect our brothers and sisters – with relationships with other Church of God congregations - with like-minded denominations - with the community?

In the Church of God, we often state we are not a denomination. Because of that we recognize that we will not all agree on priorities, praxis, principles or preferences. Our own congregations often have different ways of living out our faith. Does that mean we are not aligned?

We have much in common with other Christian churches, but there are certainly differences in our theology and traditions. Can we still claim alignment with them? What things must we be aligned with in order to work together for the Kingdom?

I do not claim to know all the answers. However, I do know that unity does not mean uniformity. I know that without alignment, the body of Christ will not advance the Kingdom, which - I would argue - is the purpose of God's church. We often are our own worst enemy – fighting with each other instead of banding together to defeat the enemy. In order to invite God to expand the Kingdom, the ground must be prepared. Are we sowing weeds instead of plowing the field?

I have a couple of thoughts as to how we can be better aligned so that we can participate with God while He is "doing a new thing" (Rev. 21:5):

- 1. Don't compare yourself or your congregation to another we are all on a different journey.
- 2. Believe that those who differ in their theology are also looking to God for their inspiration and direction. God has ONE church.
- 3. Remember a practice is not the same as a theological truth. It is often a personal, congregational, or community preference.
- 4. Trust our brothers and sisters are seeking God's will. Assume the best.
- 5. Maintain an attitude of humility. Recognize NONE of us has it totally right. We can learn from each other.
- 6. Pray for each other as we work together on different branches of the same tree. One person or church may reach a family that you will never be able to reach.

There are some denominations with which we have much in common, and others where we differ a great deal. But we are one! We are the children of God – the one body of Christ, who is the Head. This is a bedrock principle of the Church of God. "we reach our hands in fellowship to every bloodwashed one" the hymn says.

Rev. Myricks reminded us that God has put the responsibility of alignment squarely on the shoulders of the leader. What are we modeling? Those who are watching the ones who claim Jesus Christ, want to see how we treat each other. "By this will everyone know you are my disciples, if you love one another." John 5:35.

First and foremost, our alignment – personally and then corporately – must be with God and God's will. Only then will we be able to love each other – no matter what our differences. And only then will we provide a fertile environment for His Kingdom to come.

Today, I urge you to spend some time with God – find out if you are clearly aligned with Him. This will give you clarity, direction, and grace for the days ahead as you seek to align with others.


Rev. Brenda Aughenbaugh has retired as Worship Pastor of Park Hill Church of God, Parker. Brenda will be available for pulpit filling.
