## RECYCLING:

Please be a good steward and recycle! Our recycle dumpster is located on the upper grounds by the dining hall. The following items can be recycled: junk mail, magazines, office paper, brown paper bags, newspapers, paperboard, phone books, paper, cardboard, dairy and juice containers, aluminum, tin or steel cans, glass bottles and jars, and plastic bottles and containers.

# PET POLICIES

Whitehall Camp does not encourage pets.

However, pets are permitted if you abide by these guidelines:

1. Pets are to be leashed at all times when outside the cabin or camper.
2. Pets are to be confined to the leased lot of the owner.
3. Pet owners are responsible for picking up deposited residue at all times during the camping season and are to be prepared with small plastic bags for such purposes. This includes personal leased lots and pet areas.
4. Pets on a leash are to be taken only to the "Pet Walking Areas" and must be "picked up" after. Areas are located on the lower grounds in the field behind the RV section and on the upper grounds in the field behind Faith Lodge.
5. Pets are to be restricted during Camp Meeting to only the areas listed above; the walking area and the leased lot of the owner.
6. Pet owners will be asked to remove the animal from the grounds if they become a nuisance to those around them.
7. No pet, with the exception of service animals, is permitted in any buildings or any public areas managed by Whitehall Camp; i.e. lake, playground, concession stand, dining hall or any eating areas.



# CAMP MEETING POLICIES

During Camp Meeting, we ask that you help us by cooperating with the following:

- All fees should be paid at the Whitehall Summer Camp Office including utilities and other charges for cottages, mobile homes, tents, or recreational vehicles.
- Mail may be received and deposited for mailing at the Whitehall Summer Camp Office.
- If articles of value are lost or found, please report these to the Whitehall Summer Camp Office.
- No mini-bikes, bicycles, tricycles, skateboards, in-line skates, four-wheelers, or scooters are to be used on the grounds. The speed limit is 10 mph for all other transportation. All motor vehicles, including golf carts, must be driven by persons with a current, valid driver's license. All non-street legal motorized vehicles (i.e. golf carts, side-by-sides, and hoverboards) must be registered at the Summer Camp Office before being operated on the campground.
- Parents are responsible for the actions and behaviors of their children and of the children's friends in their care. Please know the whereabouts of your children and what they are doing.
- Fireworks of any kind are forbidden.
- Persons damaging or destroying camp or personal property will be held responsible.

- Garbage is to be placed **INSIDE THE DUMPSTER.**
- No garbage is to be stacked in front of the dumpsters. This is for normal household garbage only. No metal, toilets, refrigerators, furniture, or wood is to be placed in the dumpsters. Disposal of such is the responsibility of the leaseholder.
- The land surrounding Whitehall Camp is private property. The area behind the hogans, below the lake, and along Panther Spring is privately owned land. Please respect private property.
- All RVs must be parked in approved RV areas. No RVs or tents are to be located adjacent to cottages, homes, or mobile homes.
- The lake may be used only during posted times and under the supervision of the waterfront staff. See page 19 for complete information regarding lakefront regulations.
- This is a church camp and therefore modesty in dress and consideration of conduct are expected.
- No smoking, vaping, drinking of alcoholic beverages, ingesting or injecting illegal substances,
- No profane language or improper behavior will be permitted on the grounds.
- In the interest of unity and reconciliation, no political or other controversial items should be displayed.
- Anyone found to be a disturbance, creating an unsafe environment, or acting with malicious intent toward guests during Camp Meeting, will be asked to leave the premises with no expectation of a refund.

- All persons using the camp facilities during Camp Meeting are encouraged to attend the services, conferences, and other activities of the Camp Meeting.
- Firewood is available for \$5.00 per wheelbarrow load near the entrance to the maintenance building on Riggle Road. Please pay for the wood at the Summer Camp Office.
- No evening campfires are permitted until after the conclusion of the evening service. Campfires are to be in fire rings and not left unattended. Fires should be extinguished at the end of the night. Whitehall reserves the right to ban fires during dry periods.
- Please respect quiet time starting at 11:30 pm. Individuals should be in their residences by midnight. All non-residents must leave the grounds by midnight.
- All media (TVs, radios, CDs, iPods, etc.) are not to be played outside of dwellings or in cars in a loud and disruptive manner.
- Single persons under age 18 are not permitted to stay overnight on the grounds without an adult in the same residence.

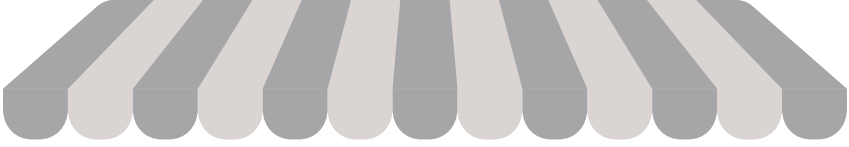

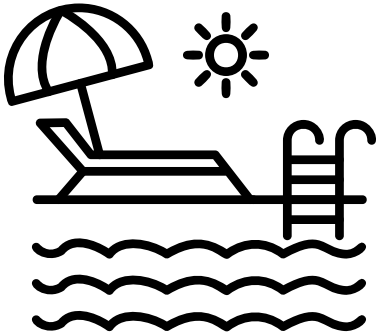

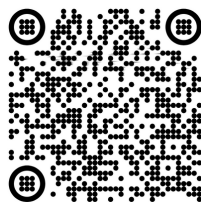
